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Introduction Some history

- Research libraries an integral part of the research community
 - The National Library founded 1640 as the library of the Royal Academy of Åbo (now the University of Helsinki)
- Over time, several changes in the environment
 - technological, like the printing press
 - social, like the suffrage of universities from the church
- The digital era is the latest of these changes



Introduction Dawn of the Digital Era

- Changes at all levels of academic life
 - teaching
 - research
 - publishing
- Role of libraries is changing
 - new material published digitally
 - old material digitised
 - users expect digital services
- How to keep up with the times?



Role of Libraries Proactive Approach

- A library exists to serve its users
 - not just current but also past and future ones!
- Emphasis on the needs of scholars
 - should be obvious for a research library
 - but must not forget the rest of the clientele
- Goal: to stay relevant
 - what do people need from the library?
 - what *will* they need?



Role of Libraries Needs of Future Users

- So, what do scholars need from the library
 - as a source of research papers
 - as a source of research material
- Focus on the humanities
 - sciences and medicine have their own sources for data
- Focus on digitised material
 - natively digital not to be forgotten, though



Staying Relevant Taking a closer look

- What does the digital revolution mean?
 - especially for a research library
 - not easy to see in detail
- Several areas worthy of study
 - digitising old material
 - metadata collection, annotation
 - uses of crowdsourcing
- Should a library do this?
 - well, yes!

- Symbiosis between faculty and library
 - how can the library serve scholars
 - how can the scholars help the library
- Joint project
 - library experience
 - digital archiving
 - research methods
 - software engineering

 - digitisation centre in Mikkeli
- University of Helsinki
 - research in language technology and data mining
 - representing entity for CLARIN ERIC
- Mikkeli Polytechnic
 - programme in digital archiving
- Mikkeli University Centre and DigitalMikkeli



Action Plan Joint Research Group

- Set up a research group in Mikkeli
 - professor in digital corpora (UH, NL)
 - 1–2 Ph.D. students (UH)
 - 1–2 Ph.D.-level teacher/researchers (MPoly)
 - expert in digitising (NL)
- Time frame: 2013–16
 - long-term goal to have permanent collaboration
 - funding currently finalised for 2013–14



Action PlanProjected Research Areas

- Ways to increase the quality of data
 - crowdsourced annotation, metadata collection
 - making the data available
- Methods for using the data
 - data-driven research
 - leveraging language technology for other fields
